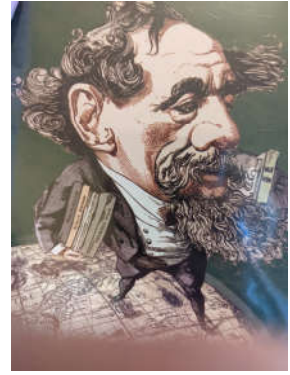

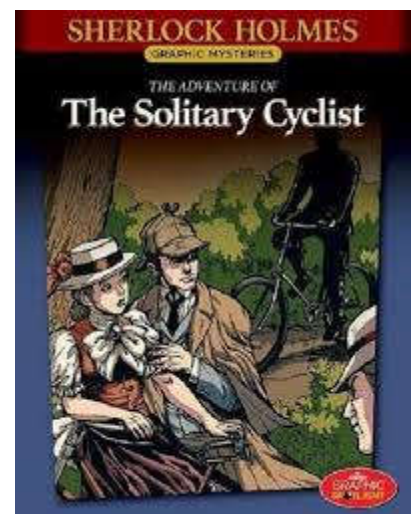
**We meet Sat. February 8, 11 am at the Beachwood County Library, Rm. B.**
